Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

Last week both the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches united in a common bond. On September 1, 2017, Pope Francis and Patriarch Bartholomew issued a Joint Message on the World Day of Creation. In part, the message stated that “In the beginning, God intended humanity to cooperate in the preservation and protection of the natural environment....The earth was entrusted to us as a sublime gift and legacy, for which we all share responsibility until, in the end, all things in heaven and on earth will be restored in Christ. (Eph. 1:10) Our human dignity and welfare are deeply connected to our care for the whole of creation.”

Yet, both church leaders voiced concern that history demonstrates “a morally decaying scenario where our attitude and behavior towards creation obscures our calling as God’s co-operators....Our insatiable desire to manipulate and control the planet’s limited resources, and our greed for limitless profit...have alienated us from the original purpose of creation. We no longer respect nature as a shared gift; instead, we regard it as a private possession.

The consequences of this alternative worldview are tragic and lasting. The human environment and the

natural environment are deteriorating together...Our obligation to use the earth’s goods responsibly implies the recognition of and respect for all people and all living creatures....to work towards sustainable and integral development...We fervently invite all people of good will to dedicate a time of prayer for the environment...and to pledge commitment to its care and preservation for the sake of future generations. After all, we know that we labor in vain if the Lord is not on our side (Ps.126-127), if prayer is not at the center of our reflection and celebration.

...Hear the cry of the earth...attend to the needs of the marginalized, but above all respond to the plea of millions...for the healing of our wounded creation...and give priority to solidarity and service.”

If we choose to begin in our own back yards and nurture the small piece of creation entrusted to our care, then the world we leave behind will be a better place and the example we set will inspire those who come after us to care for the simple gifts around us so that all can enjoy what God saw, that it was good. (Gen.1:1ff.) Let us follow the Pope and Patriarch and begin to care for our part of creation.

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

La semana pasada ambas iglesias católica y ortodoxa del este unieron en un enlace común. El 1 de septiembre de 2017, el Papa Francisco y el Patriarca Bartolomé emitieron un Mensaje de Afiliación en el Cayo Mundial de la Creación. En parte, el mensaje decía: "En el principio, Dios quería que la humanidad cooperara en la preservación y protección del medio ambiente natural ... La tierra nos fue confiada como un sublime don y legado, del cual todos compartimos la responsabilidad hasta, en el fin, todas las cosas en el cielo y en la tierra serán restauradas en Cristo. (Efesios 1:10) Nuestra dignidad humana y bienestar están profundamente conectados con nuestro cuidado por toda la creación. "

Sin embargo, ambos líderes de la iglesia expresaron su preocupación de que la historia demuestra "un escenario moralmente decadente donde nuestra actitud y comportamiento hacia la creación oscurece nuestra vocación como cooperadores de Dios ... Nuestro deseo insaciable de manipular y controlar los limitados recursos del planeta y nuestra codicia de ganancias ilimitadas ... nos han alienado del propósito original de la creación. Ya no respetamos la naturaleza como un regalo compartido; en cambio, consideramos que es una posesión privada.

Las consecuencias de esta cosmovisión alternativa son trágicas y duraderas. El medio humano y el entorno natural se están deteriorando juntos ... Nuestra obligación de utilizar los bienes de la tierra de manera responsable implica el reconocimiento y el respeto de todas las personas y todos los seres vivos ... para trabajar hacia un desarrollo sostenible e integral ... Invitamos fervientemente a todas las personas de bien la voluntad de dedicar un tiempo de oración para el medio ambiente ... y de comprometer el compromiso de su cuidado y preservación por el bien de las generaciones futuras. Después de todo, sabemos que trabajamos en vano si el Señor no está de nuestro lado (Salmos 126-127), si la oración no está en el centro de nuestra reflexión y celebración.

... Escucha el grito de la tierra ... atiende las necesidades de los marginados, pero sobre todo responde a la súplica de millones ... para la sanación de nuestra creación herida ... y da prioridad a la solidaridad y al servicio ". Si decidimos comenzar en nuestros propios patios traseros y nutrir la pequeña pieza de creación confiada a nuestro cuidado, entonces el mundo que dejamos será un lugar mejor y el ejemplo que establezcamos inspirará a aquellos que vienen después de nosotros a cuidar de los simples regalos alrededor de nosotros para que todos puedan disfrutar de lo que Dios vio, que era bueno. (Gen.1: 1ss.)
