Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

Many of us are old enough to remember when you didn't need to lock your house, your car or even your office building. Times have changed from when we lived in a less violent social setting and a less threatened existence. Nowadays you need locks on everything; but, sometimes even that security is not what it seems. Such was the lesson learned this past weekend.

Shortly before the 7:30 AM Sunday Mass, one of the Greeters for St. Mary came up to me to inform me that a few parishioners noticed the money box for the Votive Candles by the Blessed Mother statue was lying on the floor. I responded that I'd look into the matter after Mass. Well, time got away from me and with having to get Fr. Carroll back to Saint Ambrose with the help of our seminarian Michael, and getting myself back there to lead the morning Rosary, I forgot about the collection box.

On Monday morning I returned to Saint Mary to investigate the matter. I found out that FOUR of the boxes had, like the one by the Blessed Mother, the locks cut off of them and all the money stolen! Only the Votive Stand by Our Lady of Guadalupe was not robbed since it had a different size lock on it that, apparently, the thief could not break! The parish lost about One Hundred Fifty Dollars—the usual revenue from people lighting Vo-

tive Candles on a weekly basis!

Of course, there is no way to know who the culprit might be, or even if that term should be singular. The point taken is this—the parish will not be subjected to the expense of new locks and keys. I am asking that IF you choose to light a Votive Candle, PLEASE place the money in an envelope in the weekly collection and mark it “For Votive Candles” or something of the like so that record can be accurately kept of income from that source. Both parishes will continue to offer Votive Candles. Hopefully Saint Ambrose will not experience the same situation; but, regardless, parishioners for either church are asked to simply place your donations for candles in marked envelopes for the regular collection.

This is not the first theft at St. Mary and, perhaps, it will not be the last. We cannot secure either parish by locked doors until the close of the school day; since each campus requires the use of the church basement for cafeterias for the children. We will have to rely upon the Guardian Angels to help protect us all!

## DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

Muchos de nosotros somos lo suficientemente mayores como para recordar cuándo no necesitas cerrar tu casa, tu automóvil o incluso el edificio de tu oficina. Los tiempos han cambiado desde que vivíamos en un entorno social menos violento y una existencia menos amenazada. Hoy en día necesitas bloqueos en todo; pero, a veces incluso esa seguridad no es lo que parece. Tal fue la lección aprendida este fin de semana pasado.

Poco antes de la misa del domingo a las 7:30 AM, uno de los Greeters para St. Mary se me acercó para informarme que unos pocos feligreses notaron que la caja de dinero para las velas votivas junto a la estatua de la Santísima Madre yacía en el piso. Respondí que examinaría el asunto después de la Misa. Bueno, el tiempo se me escapó y tuve que conseguir al Padre. Carroll regresó a San Ambrosio con la ayuda de nuestro seminarista Michael, y al volver a mí para dirigir el Rosario de la mañana, me olvidé de la caja de recolección.

El lunes por la mañana regresé a Saint Mary para investigar el asunto. Descubrí que CUATRO de los cuadros tenían, como uno de la Santísima Madre, las cerraduras cortadas y todo el dinero robado. ¡Solamente el Soporte Votivo de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe no fue robado porque tenía un cierre de diferente tamaño que, aparentemente, el ladrón no podía romper! La parroquia perdió alrededor de Cien Cincuenta Dólares, el ingreso habitual de personas que encienden velas votivas semanalmente.

Por supuesto, no hay forma de saber quién podría ser el culpable, o incluso si ese término debería ser singular. El punto tomado es esto: la parroquia no estará sujeta al gasto de nuevas cerraduras y llaves. Le pido que si elige encender una Vela votiva, coloque el dinero en un sobre en la colección semanal y márkelo "Para velas votivas" o algo similar para que se pueda mantener con precisión los ingresos de esa fuente. Ambas parroquias continuarán ofreciendo Votive Candles. Con suerte, Saint Ambrose no experimentará la misma situación; pero, independientemente, se les pide a los feligreses de cualquiera de las iglesias que simplemente coloquen sus donaciones para velas en sobres marcados para la colección regular.

Este no es el primer robo en St. Mary y, tal vez, no será el último. No podemos asegurar ninguna parroquia por puertas cerradas hasta el final del día escolar; ya que cada campus requiere el uso del sótano de la iglesia para cafeterías para los niños. ¡Tendremos que depender de los Ángeles Guardianes para ayudar a protegernos a todos!
